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Day 1: San Francisco Icons & Sausalito Escape

Start your day with a ride on the Powell-Hyde cable car, the most scenic route in the city, offering breathtaking views as it climbs over Nob Hill and down toward Fisherman's Wharf. Hop off at Lombard Street, the famously crooked road lined with colorful flowerbeds, and take a few photos before heading to the waterfront. Stroll through Pier 39, where lively street performers entertain crowds and watch the sea lions bask in the sun at their floating docks. Continue along the Embarcadero, enjoying picturesque Bay Bridge and Alcatraz views, before stopping at the Ferry Building Marketplace. Here, you'll find a culinary paradise, grab an early lunch at Hog Island Oyster Co., known for its ultra-fresh oysters, grilled cheese sandwiches, and clam chowder.

After lunch, catch a ferry to Sausalito, a 30-minute cruise that offers postcard-worthy views of the Golden Gate Bridge and San Francisco skyline. Once in Sausalito, explore downtown's waterfront promenade, lined with boutique shops, art galleries, and charming cafés. Visit Vina del Mar Park, home to grand elephant statues and a beautiful fountain, then wander up to the colorful floating houseboats, where local artists and musicians have long made their homes. Stop for a sweet treat at Lappert's Ice Cream, where their famous ube macapuno and macadamia nut flavors are a favorite. Enjoy a relaxed waterfront dinner at Scomas of Sausalito, a waterfront mainstay with unsurpassed ocean views as the sun sets. Order the Dungeness Crab Spaghetti or the chianti braised wagyu short ribs while watching sailboats glide across the bay. End the evening with a ferry ride, taking in the illuminated city skyline.

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Day 2: Oracle Park & Haight-Ashbury's Hippie Vibes

Kick off the day with a behind-the-scenes tour of Oracle Park, the stunning bayfront home of the San Francisco Giants. Whether you're a baseball fan or not, this immersive tour offers a chance to walk on the field, sit in the dugout, and peek inside the team's batting cages and press box. Admire the bronze Willie Mays statue at the entrance and learn about the Giants' legendary history, including their three recent World Series titles. After the tour, grab a coffee at Philz Coffee, a local favorite famous for its Mint Mojito iced coffee, before going to Haight-Ashbury, one of America's most iconic counterculture neighborhoods.

Step back in time as you arrive at the corner of Haight & Ashbury, the epicenter of the 1967 Summer of Love. Explore legendary shops like Amoeba Music, one of the largest independent record stores in the world, where you can flip through vintage vinyl and music memorabilia. Check out quirky boutiques like Love on Haight, a psychedelic tie-dye paradise, or Wasteland, a top-notch vintage clothing store. As you stroll, take in the bohemian street art and the vibrant murals paying tribute to music icons like Jimi Hendrix and Janis Joplin. For history buffs, stop at 710 Ashbury Street, the former house of the Grateful Dead, where rock legends once lived and hosted jam sessions. Head into Golden Gate Park and relax at Hippie Hill, where locals gather for drum circles, frisbee games, and an atmosphere of peace and love.

As evening falls, dine at Cha Cha Cha, a lively Caribbean tapas bar that embodies the free-spirited energy of Haight-Ashbury. Inside, twinkling lights, vibrant murals, and Latin music set the stage for an unforgettable meal. Order the Jamaican jerk chicken, spicy Cajun shrimp, fried plantains, and a pitcher of their famous red sangria. The restaurant's communal vibe makes it a fun and casual spot to unwind after a day of exploring. If you're up for a nightcap, grab a craft cocktail at The Alembic, a renowned speakeasy-style bar just down the street.

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Day 3: Napa Valley Wine Country & Michelin-Starred Fare

Rise early for a scenic drive to Napa Valley, where rolling vineyards, world-class wineries, and breathtaking views await. The journey takes about 1.5 hours, passing through Marin's golden hills and across the Carneros wine region, known for its fog-kissed Chardonnay and Pinot Noir vines. Start your wine-tasting adventure at Domaine Carneros, an elegant French-style chateau overlooking acres of vineyards. Known for its sparkling wines crafted by the Champagne Taittinger family, this winery offers a luxurious outdoor terrace tasting experience. Savor their Brut Rosé, Le Rêve Blanc de Blancs, and award-winning Pinot Noir, paired with cheese and caviar for an indulgent start to the day.

Next, head into downtown Napa for a lunch stop at Oxbow Public Market, a foodie haven featuring local vendors and gourmet specialties. Choose from artisan tacos at C Casa, a fresh seafood platter from Hog Island Oyster Bar, or a wood-fired pizza from Live Fire Pizza. Please don't leave without trying the famous English muffins from Model Bakery, hailed by Oprah as one of her favorite treats. After lunch, continue your wine journey with a visit to V. Sattui Winery in St. Helena, an Italian-inspired estate known for its beautiful picnic grounds, award-winning Cabernet Sauvignon, and bustling marketplace. Enjoy a tasting flight featuring their signature Old Vine Zinfandel, Madeira, and Reserve Cabernet, or grab a bottle to sip outdoors beneath the shady oak trees. If time allows, take a short drive to Oakville Grocery, the oldest continually operating grocery store in California, to pick up a few gourmet souvenirs.

As the sun sets, return to San Francisco for dinner at Frances, a Michelin-starred neighborhood gem in the Castro District. This boutique, farm-to-table restaurant is known for its seasonally driven menu. Begin your meal with their legendary applewood-smoked bacon beignets, followed by seared scallops, porcini-marbled steak, or duck confit, all expertly prepared with fresh, locally sourced ingredients. For wine lovers, Frances offers a unique wine-by-the-ounce menu, allowing guests to sample various premium California wines. End the evening with a decadent brown butter tart or a seasonal fruit cobbler, the perfect sweet finale.

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
